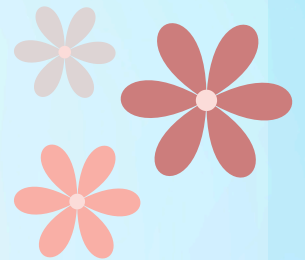
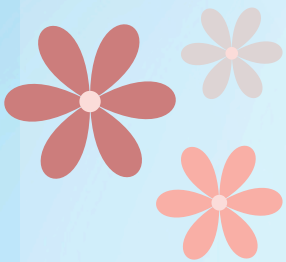

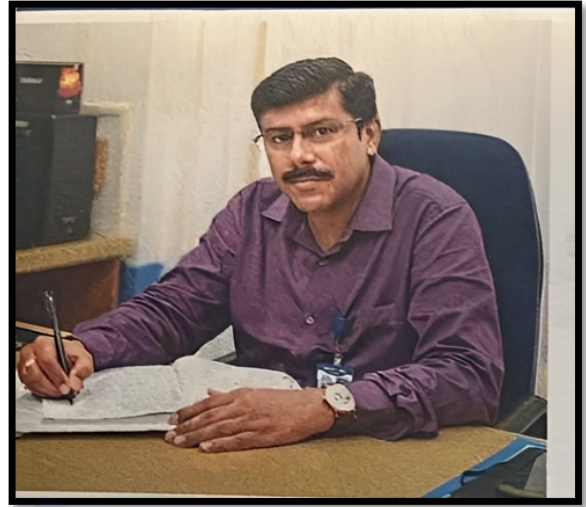

But every now and then the stars align and you get to glide”.

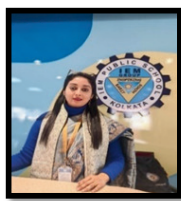

And as the honour comes with further great responsibilities, so shall be our consistency and enthusiasm to give back much better.



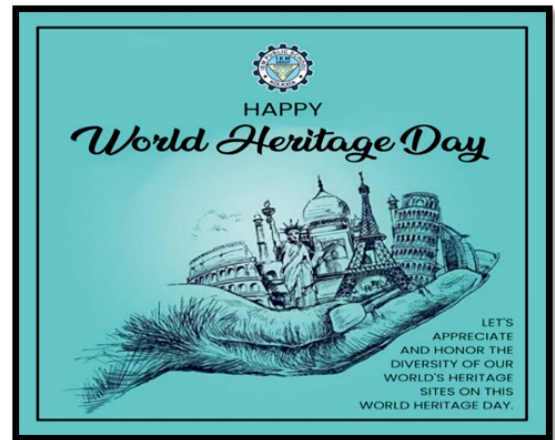
EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

The Tenerife Airport Disaster: Aviation's Deadliest Tragedy



On March 27, 1977, the deadliest accident in aviation history unfolded at Los Rodeos Airport (now Tenerife North Airport) on the Spanish island of Tenerife in the Canary Islands. Two Boeing 747 jumbo jets from KLM and Pan Am collided on the runway amid thick fog, killing 583 people and leaving only 61 survivors from the Pan Am flight. Background and Diversions.

Background and Diversions

The tragedy began earlier that day at Gran Canaria Airport, where a bomb exploded in 97 the terminal at 13:15 UTC, planted by the Canary Islands Independence Movement. This forced the temporary closure of Gran Canaria, diverting flights including KLM Flight 4805 from Amsterdam and Pan Am Flight 1736 from Los Angeles via New York. Los Rodeos, a small regional airport, was unprepared for the influx of large jets. Parked planes blocked the main taxiway, forcing aircraft to use the runway for taxiing. KLM's captain, Jacob Veldhuyzen van Zanten—a respected chief instructor—decided to refuel there, delaying departure by 35 minutes and adding fuel that later intensified the fire.

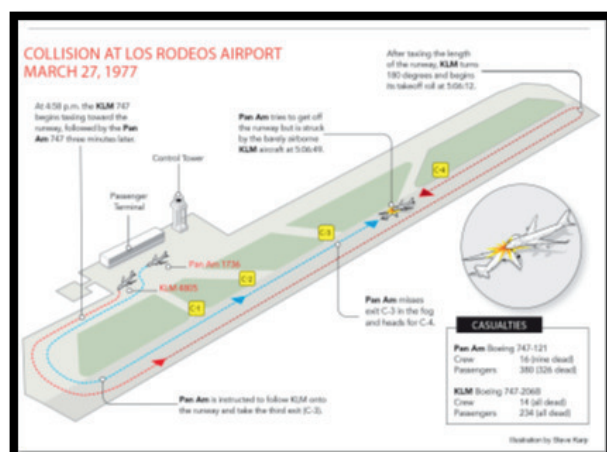
The Collision Sequence

By late afternoon, fog reduced visibility to under 100 meters. KLM backtaxied on the runway for takeoff, while Pan Am was instructed to follow and exit at taxiway C3—but missed it due to unmarked exits and confusion, reaching C4 instead. KLM requested clearance. The controller gave routing instructions but said "stand by for takeoff." Radio interference from Pan Am's transmission ("We're still taxiing down the runway") garbled the message. KLM's first officer read back ambiguously as "We are now at takeoff," and the captain advanced throttles without full clearance, believing it approved.

Causes and Investigation

Spanish investigators blamed KLM's captain for takeoff without clearance, driven by dutytime pressures and overconfidence. Dutch reports highlighted mutual misunderstandings, fog, blocked taxiways, and non-standard phrases like "OK." Contributing factors included no ground radar, language barriers (non-native English), crew hierarchy silencing juniors, and airport overload. Cockpit voice recorders revealed KLM's flight engineer questioning "Is [Pan Am] not clear?" but accepting the captain's "Oh yes."

Aftermath and Legacy

Rescue was delayed by fog and smoke; survivors waited hours. KLM accepted responsibility, paying \$110 million in compensation. The disaster prompted global changes: standardized phraseology ("cleared for takeoff" only), Crew Resource Management (CRM) training to empower all crew, and English as the aviation language. Tenerife North got ground radar, and a new south airport opened in 1978. Memorials honor victims, including in Amsterdam and Tenerife. This event underscores how small errors cascade into catastrophe, saving countless lives through safer aviation.

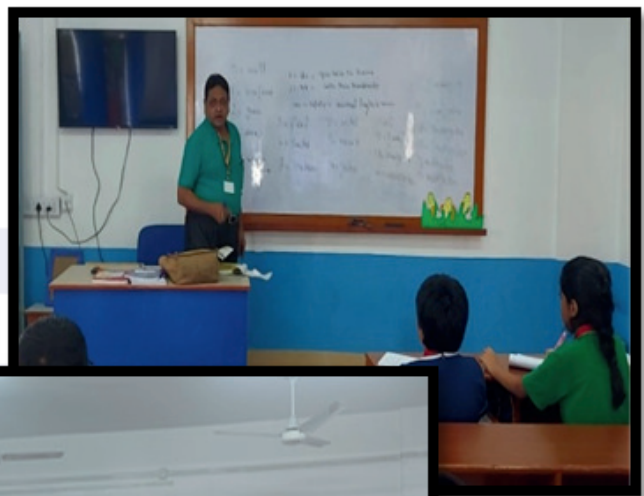

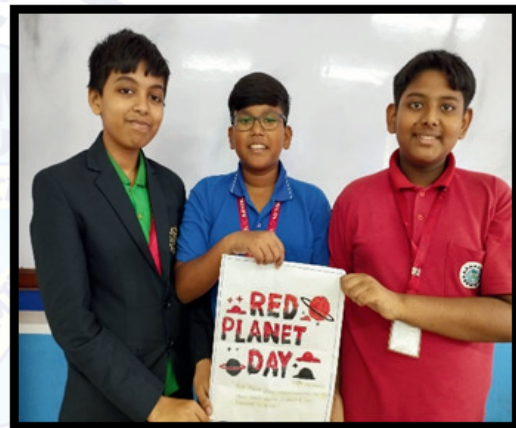

- **Action Songs:** Action songs were conducted to combine music with movement, enhancing motor skills, memory, and enjoyment in learning.

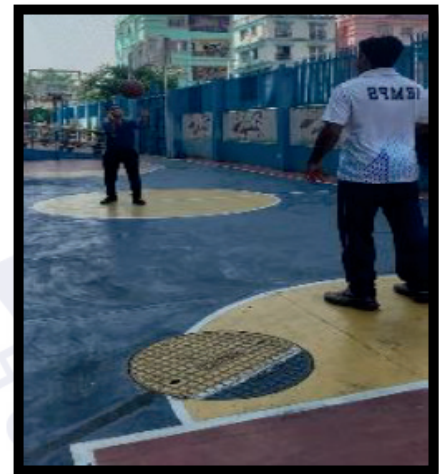

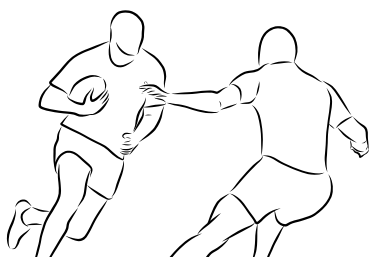
